#### 3. Jobs

#### 4. Location

#### 5. City life

We wanted to move to a cultural city where we could attend festivals, concerts and shows. We also wanted somewhere our kids would have plenty of learning opportunities for the future.

We absolutely loved Perth and as I had family there it was our first choice initially. But when we started reviewing our wish-list, we quickly realised that Brisbane offered everything we needed.

Brisbane has affordable housing in the outer suburbs. Despite everyone saying that Brisbane doesn't have any beaches, it really does. They aren't huge sweeping beaches, but there are some pretty beaches to the north and south of the city, and it is in-between the Sunshine Coast and Gold

Coast, so it is easy to get to the bigger surf beaches for days out. It also has some amazing islands just off the coast too.

It offers a great climate all year round (it does get humid at times but those are the days that air conditioning was invented for!)

We found the job options were better for my husband and we felt Brisbane is well connected for day trips, weekend breaks and holidays.
